SAINTS RELICS ECUMENICAL TOUR

The relics of 11 saints, including those of St Peter Chanel, the patron saint of the New Zealand Catholic Church, and Australasia's first saint, St Mary MacKillop, will be hosted by the Auckland diocese from April 26 to May 25.

They will be formally welcomed next

Saturday April 27 at 3pm followed by a Mass led by Bishop Steve Lowe at 4pm at St Patrick's Cathedral.

This is a unique and historic opportunity to welcome the relics of saints from the Eastern and Western Catholic Churches which will bring together relics of:

St Maroun, the spiritual father of the Maronite
Catholic Church; St Peter Chanel, Patron Saint of
New Zealand, Roman Catholic Church;
St Charbel, Maronite Catholic Church;

St Rafqa, Maronite Catholic Church; St Volodymyr Pryima, Ukrainian Catholic Church; St Nehmetallah. Maronite Catholic Church:

St Neimictanan, Marointe Catholic Church;
St Alphonsa, India's first female Saint, Syro-Malabar;
St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, RC Church;
St Mariam Baouardy, Melkite Catholic Church;
Blessed Martyrs of Patulin, Ukrainian Catholic
Church; Servant of God Fr Ragheed Aziz Ganni,
Chaldean Catholic Church.

TODAY'S READINGS

Because we recorded for Shine TV last weekend we will use the readings for the the Third Sunday of Easter this weekend.

FIRST READING - Acts 3:13-15, 17-19 In the gospel Luke will tell us that the message of the risen Christ is the message of forgiveness. This message must be preached in Jerusalem, then in surrounding area, and then to the very ends of the earth. In this reading Luke (also the author of the Acts of Apostles) presents Peter starting off the Church's witness to the resurrection by preaching this very message in Jerusalem.

SECOND READING ~ 1 John 2:1-5 We are called to live close to God by lives of justice and holiness, and we are a people who have our sins forgiven through Jesus Christ, our priest: he intercedes for us with the Father.

GOSPEL ~ Luke 24: 35-48 We have received the gift of peace from the Lord;

we in turn must bear witness to this peace and forgiveness.

~ POPE FRANCIS ON BEING A GOOD SHEPHERD ~

Christians must develop a pastoral heart to care for those who have not heard the Gospel or who have left the fold, Pope Francis has said.

"By being with Jesus, we discover that his pastoral heart always beats for the person who is confused, lost, far away,"

"Jesus never said, 'Let them sort themselves out,' he went out to find them."

Pope Francis encourages Christians to model themselves on Jesus, the Good Shepherd, longing for those who have left the church just as a shepherd longs for lost sheep, rather than treating them as "adversaries or enemies."

"When we meet them at school, work or on the streets of our city,

why don't we think instead that we have a beautiful opportunity to witness to them the joy of a Father who loves them and has never forgotten them?"

Being a shepherd is not merely a job, but a "true and proper way of life: 24 hours a day," he says. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, "does not just do something for us, but he gives his life for us."
